In March 1919, Walter Gropius became the head of the Weimar Academy of Fine Arts, which he united with the former School of Arts and Crafts to establish the State Bauhaus Weimar. The Staatliches Bauhaus (German: [ʃtaːtlɪçs ˈbaʊhaʊs]), commonly known as the Bauhaus, was a German art school operational from 1919 to 1933 that combined crafts and the fine arts, and was famous for the approach to design that it publicized and taught. The Bauhaus movement began in 1919 when Walter Gropius founded a school with a vision of bridging the gap between art and industry by combining crafts and fine arts. Bauhaus: Bauhaus, school of design, architecture, and applied arts that existed in Germany from 1919 to 1933. It was founded by architect Walter Gropius, and notable members included Paul Klee, Wassily Kandinsky, Marcel Breuer, and Ludwig Mies van der Rohe.
